How it works: Enjoy books throughout the summer! Fill in an Epiphany School summer bingo sheet **OR** reading log.

Ideas for book titles: See included bookmarks. Recommendations are from Epiphany students and Jen Wilkinson.

Ways to attend the Friday, September 13, 2019 Summer Reading Celebration:

- Fill one horizontal (↔), one diagonal (↖ or ↗) **AND** one vertical (↑↓) line on your bingo sheet with book titles.  
**OR**
- Fill out a reading log with titles and ratings of fourteen books.

To have your name added to a raffle for an independent bookstore gift card: Fill in all 25 bingo squares with book titles you read while doing the Challenges.

How to submit a completed bingo sheet or reading log: Return it to Jen Wilkinson by Wednesday, September 11, 2019.

Frequently asked questions:

- What do I write on the bingo sheet?

Two things: 1) your name 2) titles of books

- Can I write the same book in more than one bingo box?

Yes. Try to read for 20 minutes (or more!) for each bingo spot. For example, reading in your pajamas with a friend equals 40 minutes of reading.
